



RANGERS ROCK TRAIL – 4.5KM

The route starts on the junction of East Shore and Ranger Rock Road. Starting up Ranger Rock Road, the route takes you along rough Jeep track into land with a slight incline that's not too heavy on the lungs! Roughly 1.5km in you will see a signboard for Rangers Rock - this is definitely worth the climb up the koppie where the lowveld shows off some of her spectacular views to the West. Watch out for the young knobthorn trees on the legs, they know no limits!

Carry on until you hit the junction with Marula way and head right down the incline. 500m on you will see a sign for Pan 26, turn left and follow the trail for approximately 300m before sighting the pan. By this point most the game would have moved off but look deep into the bush - they will be watching you with interest. Backtrack on yourself to Marula way and carry on down past the iconic Marula Tree towards East Shore Road. Turn right and stretch those legs on the last Km.

The vegetation along this trail is open knobthorn acacia bush veld interspersed with Marula trees. Visibility is good and there is a bounty of bird life along the way. Game will include large herds of wildebeest plus the occasional territorial bull. They will generally run around you and backtrack to their initial start point. Impala, bushbuck, reedbuck, nyala, warthog, kudu, zebra also sighted frequently.

Distance - 4.5km

Ascent - 22m
